### Introduction

The Milstein Division is one of the largest genealogical collections freely open to the public. What follows is a <u>selective</u> list of resources with an emphasis on NYC. All sources cited are located in the Milstein Division (Room 121) or the Microform Room (Room 119).

## **Library Catalog**

The NYPL Classic Catalog (**catalog.nypl.org**) includes all of the books, periodicals and microforms in the Milstein Division, both current and retrospective, including <u>all</u> materials acquired from the New York Genealogical & Biographical Society Library (NYGB).

### **Databases**

All Reading Rooms in the Stephen A. Schwarzman Building offer free access to the following databases:

- Ancestry Library Edition Census and Vital Records, birth, marriage and death notices, the Social Security Death Index, Passenger lists and naturalizations, Military and Holocaust Records, City Directories, New York Emigrant Savings Bank records, and African American and Native American Records.
- American Ancestors Databases of the New England Historic Genealogical Society. Includes the New England Historical and Genealogical Register (1847–1994), New England state vital records and index resources, including New York, and the New York Genealogical and Biographical Record (1870–1923).
- **Fold3** city directories, naturalization records, Civil War and Revolutionary War records, African American Archives, Native American Archives.
- **Find My Past** includes genealogical records from the United States, along with England, Ireland, New Zealand, and other smaller record sets from around the globe.
- **ProQuest Historical Newspapers** historical Newspaper databases, which include titles related to New York, Chicago, Atlanta, Baltimore, Los Angeles, Washington, D.C., the American Jewish Newspaper Series, and the United Kingdom.
- America's Historical Newspapers, 1690–1922 newspapers from across the country including early newspapers, 1690–1922, African American Newspapers, 1827–1998; Ethnic American Newspapers from the Balch Collection, 1799–1971 and Hispanic American Newspapers, 1808–1980.
