THE NEW YORK GENEALOGICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL RECORD

Overview

The New York Genealogical and Biographical Record (the NYG&B Record) began publication in 1870. *The NYG&B Record* is the second-oldest genealogical journal in the United States. Quarterly issues currently include more than 75 pages of peer-reviewed genealogical and biographical information documenting the families of New York.

Past issues included queries, biographies, obituaries, pedigrees, book reviews, publication notices, and business relating to the New York Genealogical and Biographical Society (NYG&B), established in 1869. During its early years, the journal often focused on families from the colonial New York period, specifically those living in New Amsterdam, New York City, on Long Island, and throughout the Hudson River Valley. Since the mid-1900s, articles have focused on families and records of various backgrounds from across New York State.

Every issue of the NYG&B Record contains articles that preserve the history of families and individuals who settled in New York. KINSHIP BOOKS

Overview

For more than 40 years, Arthur and Nancy Kelly of Rhinebeck, New York, abstracted and transcribed thousands of records from across New York State. Their company, Kinship Books, published more than 400 titles and numerous periodicals, which can be found in libraries and personal collections. The Kellys donated the entirety of Kinship Books to the NYG&B. A complete list of titles can be found at <https://kinshipny.com>. Titles often include religious records, account books, cemetery inscriptions, and other related records with a focus on the Hudson Valley region.

ON-SITE COLLECTIONS

Since its inception, the NYG&B has collected and preserved materials that document New York families. Our physical holdings are part of the New York Public Library (NYPL) collections at the Stephen A. Schwarzman Building, which include books, manuscripts, maps, and other materials. Items are located both in the Irma and Paul Milstein Division of United States History, Local History and Genealogy and the Manuscript Division. Key collections include:
