The NYG&B has three digitization centers around New York state. In 2021, the New York City center opened, followed by Central New York in 2024 and Western New York in 2025. Using our state-of-the-art camera and software, materials are scanned, digitally preserved, and uploaded online to an ever-growing searchable collection of New York historical records. Digitize New York also equips eligible organizations with a digitization kit, which empowers communities to digitize onsite.

The Mathewson Papers Collection

The Mathewson Papers is a manuscript collection documenting the lives, relationships, and activities of members of the Mathewson family, particularly Philip Mathewson and Jeremiah A. Mathewson, and their broader community. Spanning from 1763 onward, the collection references several locations in New York State, including Pulaski and Richland in Oswego County, as well as Canaan in Columbia County and Hamilton in Madison County.

This collection consists of two volumes of *A Chronological History of the Town of Candor*, a locally compiled historical work by Donald F. Weber (1932-2023), historian, documenting the development of the Town of Candor, Tioga County, New York. Together, the volumes present a continuous chronological narrative spanning from the town's geological background and early settlement through 1994.
