This is a name and subject index to the first six volumes of *The NYG&B Newsletter*, including the supplements to Volume 1 (Diamond Jubilee of the Building) and Volume 5 (125th Anniversary of the Society).

A Table of Contents for each issue is also included. By comparing the volume and page reference in an index entry to the Table of Contents, one can usually determine the article in which the entry appears.

The following names are *not* indexed:

Names of NYG&BS Officers and Trustees, Administrative Staff, and Editors, as listed on the second page of most issues. (Other references to these individuals *are* indexed.)

Names in pages 4-21 of the Supplement to Vol. 1, which is a reprint of an article from the *Record* on ceremonies attending the dedication of the Society's building in 1929. These names are indexed in vol. 61 of the *Record* (1930).

Names of new members of the Society, in the "Welcome to New Members" column which began with Vol. 2, No. 1 (Winter 1991). (Names of all members will be included in the next *Year Book* of the Society.)

Names of authors of "Seen Elsewhere" articles, and the names of the journals in which the articles were published (these articles are indexed by subject only).
